

INTERNAL REGULATION OF THE HELLENIC SOCIETY OF BIOCHEMISTRY AND PHYSIOLOGY OF EXERCISE

RULE 1: Supporters

Persons that do not meet the conditions to become members of the Society, but they wish to participate in the activities of the Society and to assist the Society with the accomplishment of her aim, they can register as supporters. Supporters can be undergraduate students, graduates that do not prepare master theses related to biochemistry or physiology of exercise, but also any other person as well. Supporters do not pay contribution to the Society. In order someone to acquire the status of supporter, a written application is required to the governing council and a proposal from a member of the Society. Within a period of three months after the submission, of the application, the governing council of the Society either accepts or justifiably rejects the registration of the applicant in the Society.

RULE 2: Proceedings

The proceedings of each general assembly are drawn up and signed by the President and the responsible person for the proceedings. The proceedings of each assembly of the governing council are drawn up by the General Secretary, are validated in the same or in the next meeting of the governing council and are signed by the President and the General Secretary of the Society.

RULE 3: Electronic voting

The carried electronic voting for the election of the Governing Council and the Audit Committee, lasts 24 hours and expires one hour after the end of the scheduled General Assembly for the Elections, according to the rule 14 of the constitution. After the closure of the electronic ballot box, the Election Committee counts the electronic ballots and draws up the list of the candidates for the Governing Council and the Audit Committee that were selected in each ballot. The Election Committee delivers this list to the new Governing Council along with the proceeding of the elections. The Election Committee posts a copy of the proceeding of the elections in the space where the General Assembly for the Elections takes place, immediately after its syntax.

The proceeding is also posted to the website of the Society as soon as possible and the members are informed immediately for this, through an email. A member that voted has the right to submit objection against the results of the elections into 72 hours after the sending of the aforementioned email, something that is written in the email. Then, the Governing Council checks the materials of the Election Committee and the President of the Society instructs the President of the Election Committee to delete the data of the electronic voting and to give a relevant certification to the Society.
